- 1. Steve Biesiada reported that the DPW is very busy with construction and evening line repairs although the department is running on a slim staff; the department assisted the Fire Department with water for fires; the water tower fence has been repaired after a vehicle went through it.
- 2. Brian Michelli reported that the Fire Department has had several fires and a fatality when a vehicle was driven into a retention pond near the mall; the Police Department has apprehended an individual who attempted to rob a jewelry store in the mall and he is being charged; this may be a record year for fires; the Fire Department assisted Ferrysburg in the Johnson Boiler fire.

(b.) Public Hearing: The Supervisor announced that this hearing is to hear public comment and accept written objections regarding the setting of a special assessment district for road improvements on Kendra Rd. The assessment amount would be divided equally and assessed per parcel per the request of the residents, totaling \$500.00 per parcel with frontage on Kendra Rd. and \$175.00 per parcel within Stillwater Springs Condominium Association, which has entrance on Kendra Rd. The residents would have the option of paying up front or having the amount added in equal installments to their tax bill over 5 years at 3% interest.

- 7. Donna Wilson of 5695 Kendra Rd commented on the lots getting smaller when homes are built; feels everyone will use the road who doesn't have to pay for it; homeowners are paying more than condo association.
- 8. Melvin Nielsen of 5700 N. Turning Leaf Way inquired on the project timeline.
